The daughter of Walter Hess and Edith Albin, Laurel was born in the small town of Wahpeton, ND on May 6th, 1926. In her youth she learned the value of hard work and making do with very little. Laurel went on to attend technical college while in high school and found work during the war in Washington D.C. After returning briefly to Wahpeton, she moved to the Portland, OR area and worked for KWJJ radio and Oregon Marine Supply. It was at Oregon Marine that she met Grant Wiley, married and started her family in Portland, OR, moving to the Ridgefield, WA area in the early 1970's. After over twenty years as a stay-at-home mom, Laurel started her second career with the SW WA Health Department where she served as a home health nurse and assisted parents and children in the Well Child Clinic. During these years, she served others tirelessly and considered her clients her friends. Retirement did not slow her down as she enjoyed volunteering at New Heights Church, the "I Have a Dream Foundation" of SW Washington, and numerous other

ministries. Laurel is survived by her children: Kathi Wiley-Gladson, Howard Wiley, Margaret Wiley, and Fred Wiley; six grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren; all of whom she loved dearly.
